We have several landscaping projects that are in the que to be done in 2019 however some of these may be scheduled later in the year due to weather considerations. We have marked some areas that need Brazilian PepperTree cutback or removal and those should be done fairly early in the year. Unfortunately, these pepper trees are fast growing, extremely invasive and are impossible to completely eradicate.

The drainage committee had their bi-annual inspection a few months ago and the areas of concern that are on ELWCA property will be addressed during the first quarter of 2019. The committee inspects drainage areas that are on ELWCA, ClubCorp or ELW Water property and makes recommendations to all three entities. As reported in a previous Heron, the ELWCA is currently working to develop a long term agreement with these companies regarding individual responsibilities.



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EAST LAKE WOODLANDS, THE WOODS WITH DETAIL

East Lake Woodlands is made up of long winding roads abutting up to preserve areas, landscaped areas, areas with ground cover, sod and flowers. It takes an awful lot of time and effort to keep these areas thriving.

East Lake Woodlands Community

Association is lucky to have a very active landscape committee made up of volunteers. Volunteers along with the guidance and professional opinion from PSA are able to meet monthly, drive the entire property, praise the areas that are thriving and also identify areas that may need additional attention. I wanted to share the areas recognized as well as a short summary of the findings from those areas that were included on November's inspection:

- Mowing/Edging/trimming: Turf and line trimming met height specifications. No scalping and hard edging was vertical and material was cleaned out.
- Turf Color and Turf Density: Lightly mottled consistent medium green, small reduction of color quality due to fertilizer blackout period. Photos attached to report.
- Turf Weed Control: Treat heavy dollar weed along roadway. Cross Pointe South lawns treat dollar weed, General work orders included blanket application of herbicide to St Augustine and soil when appropriate.
- Turf Insect/Disease Control/Overall Health: treat turf for disease activity. Monitor possible disease activity. Broadleaf weed count has increased. No insect activity.
- Shrub Tree Insect/Disease Control/Overall Health: Straighten Geiger tree, no significant insect or disease activity noted.
- Bed Weed Control: Remove bed weeds at Quail entrance, GH3 spray bed weeds inside of chain link fence, Woodlands Blvd. Weeds are not being removed by others, bed weeds in mimosa, remove weeds from wedelia, treat crack weeds. – photos attached in report
- Irrigation Management: Turf, shrubs, and flowers appear to be receiving sufficient irrigation with exception of the flower bed along Tampa Road.
- Shrub Pruning: Shrub should not be pruned too tightly.
- Tree Pruning: Prune pepper tree away from traffic sign, remove sucker growth, remove moss
- Cleanup or brush removal: Remove fallen branch, remove pile of palm fronds.

• Appearance of Seasonal Color: The coleus/salvia planting beds were still providing strong curb appeal....

The report always concludes with recommendations for the Association to consider to keep areas looking their best.

The PSA report is posted in its entirety on the website. We encourage all owners to view it at their convenience.

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

Nevertheless, collecting old "time pieces" is interesting and a reminder of our allotment of time on this earth.

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

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BIRD OF THE MONTH CAPPED HERON

In a recent trip to Brazil, I was amazed at the amount of different herons that there are throughout the world. I am so used to seeing herons in North America that I really did not give it much thought. The Great Egret

(actually is a heron) is the national symbol of the Audubon Society and, of course, the Heron is the symbol of East Lake Woodlands and the name of this magazine. So, I thought it appropriate to write a series of articles on different types of herons that we do not normally encounter.

This article will focus on the Capped Heron, which is endemic (found nowhere else) to the Neotropics, inhabiting the Amazonian rainforest from the center of Panama to the south of Brazil, and is also one of the least known members of the heron family. I was able to photograph this heron while on a boat travelling along the river in the Pantanal in high-speed boats while searching for Jaguars, birds and other wildlife.

The Capped Heron is very different from other herons, being the only one with a blue beak and face, and a black crown. The belly, chest, and neck are covered with yellowish-white feathers. It is literally impossible to tell the difference between the males and females.

The Capped Heron normally inhabits swamps and trenches in wet grasslands or rainforests. They prefer to forage on the shore, along riverbanks, or in floating vegetation but have been observed in flooded rice fields. They hunt mostly for fish, but also will eat aquatic insects and larvae, tadpoles, and frogs. In a typical heron hunting sequence, they will stand erect, searching for potential prey. After locating it, they will crouch slowly and extend their neck. Then finally, they will jab their beak into the water at a great speed to either catch or stab their prey. Capped Herons are thought to be crepuscular (most active during twilight hours) and they always hunt alone.

Not much is known about the breeding habits of Capped Herons except that they create a nest consisting of sticks. The nests are built in a tree or forest and the nesting sites are solitary (not with other birds). The female lays a clutch of 3 or 4 dull white eggs and the chicks hatch in approximately 1-month covered in white down. Both parents will care for the chicks even after they have fledged (able to fly).

I took all of the above photographs in 2018 in Brazil. Next month we will feature the "Whistling Heron" which is an unique, multi-colored heron.

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
